On completion of customs and immigration formalities, you will be met by a representative from Rida Travel and transferred to the Bristol Hotel.

BRISTOL HOTEL

Monday, 03 March

Morning sightseeing of Beirut, once the social and commercial hub of the Levant, and Sidon in the south, allegedly dating from Old Testament times, and with fascinating souks and ancient Crusader and Islamic buildings.

BRISTOL HOTEL

Tuesday, 04 March BEIRUT - BYBLOS

Today you will be driven to Byblos once a powerful city-state before the heyday of Greece and Rome and still with many relics from the past. Also visit the celebrated Cedars of Lebanon in the north (about 400 in number), some said to have originated in the time of King Solomon, and many over 1,500 years old.

Two nights' accommodation in a twin room with private facilities on a bed and breakfast basis.

BYBLOS SUR MER HOTEL

Wednesday, 05 March

Today, full day excursion to the fertile Beqa'a Valley (centre of the Lebanese wine-industry), where stands one of the world's greatest historical sites; the Roman temples of Ba'albeck - awe-inspiring in their size, and unforgettable in the artistry of their structure. Also visit Anjar.

BYBLOS SUR MER HOTEL

Thursday, 06 March BYBLOS - HOMS

Today you will visit Tripoli, founded by the Phoenicians and with monuments originating from the Islamic era.

Cross the border into Syria, clearing customs and immigration formalities. Continue to the celebrated Krak des Chevaliers, one of the finest surviving Crusader castles, standing some 2,000 feet high, amid green hills, and dating back to the 12th century.

Continue to Homs and the Safir Hotel.

One night's accommodation in a twin room with private facilities on a bed and breakfast basis.

SAFIR HOTEL

Friday, 07 March HOMS - ALEPPO

Today drive to Aleppo and the Shabha Cham Hotel

Two nights' accommodation in a twin room with private facilities on a bed and breakfast basis.

SHAHBA CHAM PALACE HOTEL

Saturday, 08 March

First established in the 8th Century BC, Aleppo is famous for its magnificent Citadel that towers over the city, the Umayyad Mosque, and its medieval souks. Traditionally a city of trade, this charming oriental city used to link Europe and Asia, especially

before the construction of the Suez Canal. Various styles of architecture are evident, like the caravanserais, Koranic schools and Hammams (Turkish baths) in the old city. Visit the National Museum and the old town's bustling souks (closed Fridays) built beneath limestone arches.

SHAHBA CHAM PALACE HOTEL

Sunday, 09 March ALEPPO - PALMYRA

Today the journey continues via the ethereal Church of St Simeon (where the saint spent 42 years on top of a column to be nearer to Heaven).

Drive on to Palmyra, a two-thousandyears-old city and oasis deep in the middle of the Syrian desert. Overnight at the Cham Palace Hotel.

(Approximate distance Aleppo/Palmyra is 375 kms and takes 6½ hours, including stops).

Two nights' accommodation in a twin room with private facilities on a bed and breakfast basis.

CHAM PALACE HOTEL

Monday, 10 March PALMYRA

Palmyra has been famous ever since a female monarch, the Queen Zenobia, challenged the Roman emperor Aurelian and dominated lands east of the Mediterranean and Egypt. The ruins of Palmyra give an idea of the important role played at its height, collecting taxes and defending the Eastern border of the Roman Empire from the Persians. Visit the famous archaeological site of Queen Zenobia's city, with its beautiful columns, funeral towers and subterranean tombs.

CHAM PALACE HOTEL

Tuesday, 11 March
PALMYRA - DAMASCUS

Continue south to Damascus to stay at the Cham Palace Hotel.

(Approximate distance Palmyra/Damascus is 207 kms and

takes 3 hours, including stops).

CHAM PALACE HOTEL

Wednesday, 12 March
DAMASCUS

This morning visit Damascus, the world's oldest continuously inhabited city where many civilisations have left their mark including Aramaen, Greek, Roman, Byzantine and Arab. Visit the Omayyad Mosque (largest in the world), Azem Palace, the superb National Museum, the House of Hananias and St Paul's Window.

CHAM PALACE HOTEL

Thursday, 13 March DAMASCUS - BOSRA

Today continue to Bosra, an historic Nabatean city dating back to the 14th century BC. Once the capital of the Roman Province of Arabia, it has a beautifully preserved Roman amphitheatre. You will also visit Shahiba (Philippopolis), destroyed by a volcano 1,600 years ago, and Sweida. In 244 AD a Syrian born in Shahiba, Philip the Arab, was proclaimed emperor of the Roman Empire, and Shahiba consequently developed into an important centre. A Roman theatre and a small museum of mosaics along with other various ruins remain today.

One night's accommodation in a twin room with private facilities on a bed and breakfast basis.

CHAM PALACE HOTEL

Friday, 14 March BOSRA - AMMAN

Today Syritour will drive you across the Jordanian border, visiting the beautifully preserved Greco-Roman city of Jerash, the 'Pompeii of the Middle East', with visits to the theatre, Forum and Streets of Columns.

Continue to Amman and the Philadelphia Hotel.

(Approximate distance Bosra/Amman is 160 kms and takes 4 hours, including stops).

One night's accommodation in a twin room with private facilities on a bed and breakfast basis.

PHILADELPHIA HOTEL

Saturday, 15 March AMMAN - PETRA

Leave by car in the morning via the ancient 'King's Highway' for Madeba and Mount Nebo, once-flourishing Byzantine towns with fascinating churches and mosaics. From Mount Nebo, there is a spectacular view of the Jordan Valley. From here Moses is said to have seen the 'Promised Land'. Visit the Crusader Castle at Kerak before reaching Petra and the Petra Forum Hotel.

(Approximate distance Amman/Petra is 340 kms and takes 7 hours, including stops).

Two nights' accommodation in a twin room with private facilities on a bed and breakfast basis.

PETRA FORUM HOTEL

Sunday, 16 March PETRA

A full day guided tour of this marvellous re-discovered 'Rose Red City' of rock-carved tombs and temples, reached by a short horse ride and a walk through a narrow, 'siq' fissure in the mountains. Nabateans, omans and Crusaders all left their mark upon this unique historical site, hewn from the red rocks, abandoned in the 4th Century and quite unforgettable in its impact.

Your visit will include the Treasury, Royal Tombs, Amphitheatre and Roman City. Additionally your tour can include a climb to the Monastery (1200 steps) and High Places (920 steps) if time allows.

PETRA FORUM HOTEL

Monday, 17 March
PETRA - WADI RUM - EILAT

Morning visit to Little Petra before continuing south to the desert-sands and dramatic lunar landscapes of Wadi Rum made famous by Lawrence of Arabia, where your arrangements include a short desert journey by 4-wheel drive vehicle. Continue to Aqaba and the border crossing into Israel (at approximately 1400 hours). Here you will be met by a representative from Guiding Star or the Princess Hotel and transferred to the Princess Hotel in Eilat.

(Approximate distance Petra/Wadi Rum/Eilat is 190 kms and takes 4½ hours, including stops).

Six nights' accommodation in a twin

room with private facilities on a bed and Israeli breakfast basis.

LEBANON HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Yellow Fever - a valid inoculation certificate is required if arriving from or via an endemic or infected area.

Hepatitis A, Typhoid, Tetanus and Polio - valid vaccinations are recommended, but not compulsory. (Diphtheria and hepatitis B are recommended in some circumstances - seek further advice).

Full details of the latest health requirements should be obtained from an authorised medical source, such as British Airways immunisation centres or your doctor.

SYRIA PASSPORT & VISA REQUIREMENTS

A visa is required by British passport-holders for entry into Syria.

Abercrombie & Kent London can assist with obtaining visas. Details and fees will gladly be supplied.

Other passport-holders should check with Abercrombie & Kent London.

Further to this, Syria will not permit entry to people with Israeli stamps or any other mention in their passports.

JORDAN VISA REQUIREMENTS

A visa is required by British passportholders for entry into Jordan. Abercrombie & Kent London can assist with obtaining visas. Details and fees will gladly be supplied. Other passport-holders should check with Abercrombie & Kent London.

Holders of Israeli passports must obtain a visa prior to arrival from a Jordanian Embassy.

Holders of passports of other nationalities, which have an Israeli stamp, are allowed entry into Jordan.

ARRIVAL IN ISRAEL

It is advisable on arrival in Israel to request the Israeli immigration authorities to stamp your visa on a separate sheet.

LEBANON VISA REQUIREMENTS

A visa is required by British passportholders for entry into Lebanon. Abercrombie & Kent London can assist with obtaining visas. Details and fees will gladly be supplied. Other passport-holders should check with Abercrombie & Kent London.

Entry and transit is refused to holders of Israeli passports or passports containing valid or expired Israeli visas/stamps, with the exception of non-Israeli passport holders who are in direct transit without leaving the airport.

Should you enter Israel prior to travelling to Lebanon, the relevant immigration authorities should be requested to stamp a separate sheet.
